

Our Services

Millcreek Community Services provides an array of services and supports under the Home and Community Based Services Waiver for individuals with Intellectual Disabilities and/or Developmental Disabilities. Administered by the Mississippi Department of Mental Health (DMH), services and supports funded by Medicaid are provided to eligible individuals and their families to enable the individuals with disabilities to remain with their families and in their community.

In-Home Services and Supported Employment are available anywhere in the state of Mississippi. Services for persons enrolled in the ID/DD Waiver can be arranged in any location in the state by contacting one of our 7 centers.

Services and Supports Include:

- Attendant Care—Qualified staff provides assistance in daily living skills & support involvement in community activities.
- Respite Care—Qualified or licensed staff provided supports and services to an individual for the purpose of relieving the family members or caretakers to meet planned or emergency needs.
- Day Habilitation—Services provide training at a centralized site in the individual's community, focusing on learning and improving daily living, social, self-help, communication and other adaptive skills.
- Pre-Vocational—Services aimed to prepare an individual for employment opportunities in the community by providing training in the areas of safety, problem solving and task completion
- Supported Employment—Services provide job coaching and other support necessary to acquire and maintain community employment. These services are provided at the actual work site.
- Behavior support/intervention—Licensed or certified staff provide services to assess problem behaviors which are disruptive to the community or person, school, work or home environments and design intervention strategies to support the individual successfully in that environment.
- Therapy Services—Physical, occupational, speech/language/hearing therapy are provided by licensed staff based on assessed needs on the individual's Plan of Care.
